Inauguration of the Holistic Wellness Centre

The "Holistic Wellness Centre & Skill Development Institute for Traditional Healers and Youths of Meghalaya" is a collaborative project between Meghalaya Basin Development Authority, MBMA, Shillong, Bio-Resources Development Centre, Upper Shillong, BRDC and Santhigiri Ashram, New Delhi. The Wellness Centre is located at BRDC Experimental Farm, Laitmynsaw Village, Upper Shillong.

This Wellness Centre is to make available healthcare to both Out-Patient Department (OPD) as well as In-Patient Department (IPD) based on Ayurveda, Siddha and Traditional Medicine of the state of Meghalaya, it will provide a holistic healing approach to the physical & mental care of the patients and also to promote health tourism in the State, primarily focusing on Panchakarma treatment.

It will also serve as a Skill development Centre for Traditional Healers and youths of the State for training on standardization of procedures and methods of treatment, processing of herbal preparations, packaging, etc and also give necessary guidance on programmes aimed at integrated and sustainable utilization of medicinal and aromatic plants. Personnel trained at the Centre as Master Trainers will facilitate and train others in their community such that smaller Centres can be set up in other districts of the state.

The indigenous system of medicine (Traditional medicine) has been practiced by the traditional healers since ancient times, utilizing a vast array of medicinal plants, herbs, minerals, etc. delivering primary health care or serves as a complement in Meghalaya. The integration of the Traditional Medicine with the Indian Medicine (Ayurveda, Siddha) is one of the initiatives taken up by the three (3) aforementioned partnering institute in order to create a holistic approach to healthcare system, maximizing the use of the rich Medicinal &Aromatic Plant sources that the state possessed and further, generating formulated herbal preparations catering to the wellness centre. In conclusion, the wellness centre will integrate Indian System of medicine and Indigenous Healing System of medicine for holistic approach to wellness and health of the people of the State in particular and the incoming tourists thus promoting health tourism as well.
